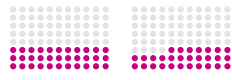

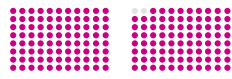

## Vocational Route

**L1** Health & Care  
**1 year**  
 At least 3 GCSEs at grade 2 or above and Literacy and Numeracy qualifications at Entry Level Plus.

**L2** Technical Extended Certificate / Diploma Health & Social Care  
**1 year**  
 A relevant Level 1 qualification or 4 GCSEs at grade 3 or above including English and Maths.

**L3** National Diploma Health & Social Care  
**2 years**  
 5 GCSEs including English Language and Maths at grade 4 or above and satisfactory DBS clearance.
